NEW RESEARCH PROJECT- SETU

SETU healthcare began in January 2024 aiming at - Strengthening Entitlement- Awareness Towards Universal health care among marginalised communities in Pratapgarh, Uttar Pradesh. The project drives to understand prevailing health beliefs, practices, awareness levels, and barriers to healthcare Service utilisation, encompassing Ayushman Bharat health insurance program and to evaluate the readiness and competence of frontline health workers and community organisations in providing suitable services to the Marginalised communities of Pratapgarh.

A comprehensive desk review of related literature, along with direct engagement with the community, is currently underway in the Patti Block of Pratapgarh district. This process aims to gather valuable insights into local healthcare dynamics, including prevalent beliefs, practices, and challenges, to ensure project initiatives effectively.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND AWARENESS SESSION

In an engaging initiative held at Kolkata Protection Officers from 11 districts of West Bengal along with representatives from State Child Welfare Board and State Child Protection, convened an interactive session. The session focused on insights to effectively addressing cases of Domestic Violence and Creating a Robust State level network to support survivors comprehensively. Community members were informed about 24X7 Crisis Support Centre, and the support being extended to women facing any form of violence.
